Our theme for the season of Lent is

"Wandering Heart: Figuring out faith with Peter".

In Peter, we see a person who is both steadfast and unsteady,



a dear friend and a betrayer, a follower and a wanderer. In Peter, we often see ourselves. By following Peter's journey, we will watch the story of Jesus unfold through the eyes of a very normal human trying to figure it all out – just like us. Faith is a constant journey of steadfast pursuit, one that ebbs and flows, seeks and wanders. Wandering is exploration, not necessarily distance from God. So throughout Lent we will reflect on the stages of our own faith journeys as well as who and what has shaped us along the way. The theme for each Sunday comes from a phrase from the hymn "Come Thou Fount," so as we wander, let us tune our hearts to sing God's grace. May we rest in streams of mercy, never ceasing.

Magnus Hirschfeld Queer Revolutionary Library

Alex Rosborough Davis' queer library was featured in The Red Gate Gallery's *Care* exhibit and is now on long-term lone to our church in what was the faith formation office. Alex's statement: "In response to the proliferation of book bans around the United States, particularly those featuring Queer characters and themes, I created the Magnus Hirschfeld Queer Revolutionary Library. The Library stands in opposition to this contemporary form of censorship."

Art in the Sanctuary

Some of the artwork in the ID Please exhibition is displayed in our sanctuary:

Hanging from the organ screen: "Link" by Margaret Keller (laser cut archival paper)

Link is about interconnectedness. I created this abstract design from both the shapes of trees and the shapes of the spaces between the trees. These positive and negative shapes (The Space Between) encompass and create our reality while holistically expressing our interdependence. My identity is linked to nature, trees, forests, and the plants around us. Link, along with an ongoing series of paintings, focuses on nature including the spaces found between.

At the Prayground:

"SheEyore" by Sarah Moon (2023, paper mache sculpture, paint, resin, crystals, hair extensions, mirror, rug)

Curator's note: Red Gate co-founder Sarah Moon co-curated and exhibited in our first show, (dis) connect, July 15 - Sept 15, 2023. Church members loved her SheEyore so much they asked if they could keep it for a while and happily, Sarah agreed! For the ID Please show, I decided to surround SheEyore with friends.

"Billie" by Bob O'Neil (2011, acrylic on canvas)

Billie was the first dog portrait I ever painted. She was our dog from 2000 to 2014. Part lab part were-not-sure-what, she was a comedienne of the first order and totally devoted to my wife Barbara and also to me. I painted this piece as a Christmas present for Barbara in 2011. Billie is depicted here standing in Lake Michigan, a favorite pastime of hers, watching the goings-on on the beach.

"Danny In Door County" by Bob O'Neil (2022, acrylic on canvas)

Danny was painted about eleven years after Billie. I had completed a number of dog and cat portraits by then. Our third golden retriever, we had him with us for almost fourteen years from 2004 to 2017. He is a big part of the reason we returned to Door County, Wisconsin for many summers. The moment he saw Lake Michigan he was ecstatic and dove right in chasing a ball or, as depicted here, his big floppy pink frisbee. Missing him, it took me a while to paint this.

"Fearless" and "In the Wild" by Pratima Murali (2016 and 2019, acrylic on canvas)

Throughout history, animals have been regarded as powerful spiritual messengers, embodying qualities and virtues that humans aspire to possess. Tigers carry an identity reflecting strength, courage, and protection. They also portray fearlessness in the face of adversity. The long necked giraffe, its gentle demeanor constantly reminding us to keep our head up high, stay grounded when reaching new heights and look towards the future.
