Annual Meeting - Sunday January 26


Notice is hereby given that the Annual Meeting of the members of The First Congregational Church of St. Louis will take place on Sunday, January 26, 2025. The meeting will follow an abbreviated worship service and will begin at 10:15 a.m., for the following purposes:

- 1. To vote on changing the quorum for congregational and special meetings from 40 to 20.
- 2. To approve a budget for 2025.
- 3. To approve a slate of Council and Ministry Team members for 2025.
- 4. Such other business as may come before the congregation.

A quorum of forty (40) members must be present before a vote can be taken. Members of any duration are eligible to vote and friends of the Church are invited to attend, although they are not eligible to cast a ballot.
